## Chapter 46. Offenses Against Property

## Sec. 11.46.320. Criminal trespass in the first degree.

(a) A person commits the crime of criminal trespass in the first degree if the person enters or remains unlawfully(1) on land with intent to commit a crime on the land; or

(2) in a dwelling.

(b) Criminal trespass in the first degree is a class A misdemeanor.

## Sec. 11.46.330. Criminal trespass in the second degree.

(a) A person commits the crime of criminal trespass in the second degree if the person enters or remains unlawfully  $% \left( {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{c_{{}}}} \right]}}} \right]}_{\rm{com}}}}} \right]_{\rm{com}}} \right)$ 

(1) in or upon premises; or

- (2) in a propelled vehicle.
- (b) Criminal trespass in the second degree is a class B misdemeanor.
